#### Greetings everyone,

Well, we are into week four already! The start to the year has been so busy that time has just flown by. I began the year with a CSTAR focus on being Safe & Smart as that is the major priority especially after the long break of school holidays.

For the next two week cycle I would like to take a step back and focus on the value of Consideration. I sometimes feel that this gets neglected in favour of Safe & Smart and Try Your Best when in reality all of our values are equally important. When I was at primary school (quite a few years ago now) my teachers and my parents always used to teach us about the Golden Rule i.e. "Do unto others as you would have them do unto you". Old fashioned words maybe, but just as relevant in today's society as it was then. We need to teach our children that if they want to be treated nicely, with kindness and respect then they need to treat others in the same way. Being kind, taking turns and using manners are all important habits of considerate people.

Our students are great and I see many wonderful things happening in classrooms and in the playground but I am constantly surprised at how often they come to the office to get something and forget to say "Excuse me", or "Please and Thank you". Another old adage is "Courtesy costs nothing" and our staff (quite rightly) insist on this. Children who do not use their manners are reminded of the appropriate way to make a request and I would like to think that this is a common practice across both school and home environments.

In recent years Education Queensland has recognised that Staff and Student Wellbeing is critical to the success of schools and has a range of initiatives to support this. One of our schools' key priorities for school improvement is Connectedness and Character which encompasses Wellbeing. In developing our Annual Improvement Plan (currently in draft form) there are a number of strategies to support the implementation of this. Some, such as CSTAR, are well established and others are a work in progress. I look forward to sharing more information about these with you as the year progresses.

#### **Cross Country**

Our Cross Country is a little over two weeks away (Tuesday 2 March for Prep – Yr 3 and Thursday 4 March for Yr 4 – 6). It has been great to see some students preparing for the event at Kilometre Club. Please continue to encourage your children to prepare for the event. Parents are very welcome to attend (please see below for the schedule) and cheer on our students in this challenging event. If attending, we do ask that you socially distance as appropriate.

All students are encouraged to wear their house colours on their day and support their house. Students from Yrs 2 – 6 will be competing for house points to contribute to our overall house champion.

Like previous years, students in the 9yrs – 12yrs age groups will have the choice of running in a championship race or in a participation race. Each student will still be collecting house points whether they run in the championship race or the participation race but the distances vary to suit different fitness levels and will hopefully mean maximum enjoyment for all students. Any student who wishes to make our school cross country team as well as compete for ribbons must compete in the championship race over the longer distance.

As in previous years, our senior cross country course for the championship race requires students to leave the school grounds to complete a lap of Dunlop Park (please see attached example of 2km 10yr course). Like the rest of the course, this portion will be assessed on the morning of the event as well as being supervised during the event. 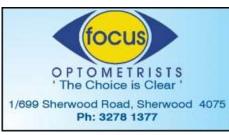

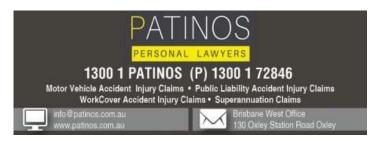
