COVID Update and Staffing Considerations

We are hearing that a third wave of COVID is breaking over Australia. Vaccinations, social distancing, washing hands, engaging in good personal hygiene and wearing a mask remain the best ways to protect yourself. Anyone who has completed their 7-day isolation due to COVID infection or is a close contact of a COVID case should wear a mask for 7 days. CSTAR FOCUS

The CSTAR value for Week 1 and 2 has been **Considerate**. Students have been investigating what empathy is and how to develop empathy. This video provides an easy to understand version of empathy for children.

Top strategies for developing empathy are: modelling- Regardless of age, students benefit from knowing what an abstract concept looks like in practice; observing Others and Discussing Body Language displayed when showing empathy to others; investing in others- taking the time to find what interested others; and really listening to understand what people are communicating and just to respond. The Empathy Game <https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=cObsOhaegfk> is a TV game show themed activity where situations of people with different emotional states are described, then the contestants choose whether a statement responding to that emotional state is “empathy” or “not empathy”.

Students are continuing to learn about the **Zones of Regulation**. They are focusing on naming emotions and feelings in themselves and others. When they can recognise the zone (blue, green, yellow or red) and their feeling, they are better able to control themselves. For example, when they recognise that they feel restless or frustrated, they are able to do something about it. Even if they don’t have the tools to do something about it, at least they can tell others how they feel using a common language.

Nationally Consistent Collection of Data

The Nationally Consistent Collection of Data on School Students with Disability (NCCD) takes place every year. The NCCD is a collection that counts:

- the number of school students receiving an adjustment or 'help' due to disability
- the level of adjustment they are receiving to access education on the same basis as other students.

Students are counted in the NCCD if they receive ongoing adjustments at school due to disability. This 'help' allows them to access education on the same basis as a child without disability. The NCCD uses the definition of disability in the Disability Discrimination Act 1992. All schools in Australia must collect information about students with disability and provide this information to education authorities. No identifying information or personal details are provided to the Australian Government in the NCCD. Protecting the privacy and confidentiality of all students is an essential part of the NCCD.
